Old Testament Reading

Lamentations 1.1-6

¹ How deserted lies the city, once so full of people! How like a widow is she, who once was great among the nations! She who was queen among the provinces has now become a slave. ² Bitterly she weeps at night, tears are on her cheeks. Among all her lovers there is no one to comfort her. All her friends have betrayed her; they have become her enemies. ³ After affliction and harsh labour, Judah has gone into exile. She dwells among the nations; she finds no resting place. All who pursue her have overtaken her in the midst of her distress. ⁴ The roads to Zion mourn, for no one comes to her appointed festivals. All her gateways are desolate, her priests groan, her young women grieve, and she is in bitter anguish. ⁵ Her foes have become her masters; her enemies are at ease. The Lord has brought her grief because of her many sins. Her children have gone into exile, captive before the foe. ⁶ All the splendour has departed from Daughter Zion. Her princes are like deer that find no pasture; in weakness they have fled before the pursuer.

New Testament Reading:

2 Timothy 1.1-14

¹ Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, in keeping with the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus, ² To Timothy, my dear son: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. ³ I thank God, whom I serve, as my ancestors did, with a clear conscience, as night and day I constantly remember you in my prayers. 4 Recalling your tears, I long to see you, so that I may be filled with joy. ⁵ I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also. ⁶ For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. ⁷ For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline. 8 So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner. Rather, join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God. ⁹ He has saved us and called us to a holy life – not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, 10 but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Saviour, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹ And of this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher. ¹² That is why I am suffering as I am. Yet this is no cause for shame, because I know whom I have believed, and am convinced that he is able to guard what I have entrusted to him until that day. 13 What you heard from me, keep as the pattern of sound teaching, with faith and love in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ Guard the good deposit that was entrusted to you – guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

Will he say to the servant when he comes in from the field, "Come along now and sit down to eat"? ⁸ Won't he rather say, "Prepare my supper, get yourself ready and wait on me while I eat and drink; after that you may eat and drink"? ⁹ Will he thank the servant because he did what he was told to do? ¹⁰ So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, "We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty."'

Update from Alison Giblett, CMS (UK), in Ukraine.

Dear friends,

Thank you for your faithfulness in supporting us, particularly over the last four years during the war. It has not been easy, though through the challenges our faith in God is growing. Repeatedly we have heard testimonies of God's miraculous answers to prayer for protection and provision. At the same time, however, some we know and love have died and many more have been wounded in battle or from the rocket and drone attacks. Many have lost everything but still found God to be faithful in providing them with new homes and communities.

As we visit soldiers and people living near the front line, many confirm that they now know that God is real and answers prayer. However, sadly, others who previously had a traditional faith, say they have seen so much horror that they can't believe there is a God who is in control. Please pray for all those involved in trauma response ministries. Several of us in TLG have been training in trauma response. All Ukrainians have experienced some level of trauma but many in the south and particularly the east have had their homes and lives torn apart.

There was a lot of publicity around the different peace talks, the first of which led to the largest exchange of captured soldiers since the start of the war. However, very sadly, the end still does not feel much closer. In the meantime, the number and size of the rockets has increased, particularly at night. Please pray for sufficient pressure to be applied to increase motivation for a just and long-term peace.

Chaplains from our church and other churches have been active in visiting the soldiers on the front line and in the hospitals as well as their families. From the beginning I have been involved in the family support, where we have the joy of seeing a few choose to attend church. Last winter I was also invited to be a full chaplain, so have been participating in the training and activities. The need far outweighs our resources in terms of people and finances for this huge and growing task.

In addition to the suffering described above, doctors have noticed a large increase in the number of heart attacks, heart problems, strokes, cases of cancer and other terminal diseases. Lots of friends are having to undergo chemotherapy or have operations to remove growths. Friends and I have also suffered a rapid loss of teeth and crowns. I lost four last winter. Most people can't afford the luxury of medical insurance, so it is a huge burden on families to try and cover the cost when they get an alarming diagnosis. In TLG we have

several encouraging testimonies of these needs being met through generous church friends. The economy is struggling and so inflation runs high above social support and pay adjustments. At the end of June, I served in another camp in Western Ukraine for children from families who had suffered significantly due to the war through loss of a family member or forced relocation. It was so good to help them have fun, in particular those who started the week very closed.

Kyiv was one of the 30 cities where the evangelism programme Million (Souls) Month took place. We had two weeks of personal and public evangelism on the streets and worship nights every other evening. It culminated in a march for Jesus through the city historical centre in the afternoon, and an open-air evangelistic concert by the Ukrainian Arch of Freedom. This coincided with the National Day of Prayer, which David Hathaway has organised for the last seven years. It was a joyous day, bringing unity and strong public witness. We thank God for the increasing national recognition that we need to rely on God. The Day of Independence on 24 August has now been made an annual Day of Prayer.

I am extremely grateful for the opportunity God gave me in August to have a family holiday specifically to participate in reunions with both sides of the family. These were prompted by my sister Cynthia and her husband Andrew's first visit to the UK in 16 years (they haven't been since before they got married). Both reunions were very special times to build good relationships and memories. I returned to Ukraine in time for our three days of prayer and fasting.

The translation and dubbing of the Genesis (inner healing) process videos is progressing gradually. I am really looking forward to having these videos made available to people who would like to run groups in their own locations. Please pray for the completion of this process and in particular for a new team of facilitators to the serve many people who need support. **Alison Giblett**

Diocesan and Parish facilitation teams have decided to carry on facilitating the essence of Hope25, that is sharing our hope in Jesus, into the future. With that in mind our parish team have changed their name to Good News Facilitators (GNF for short) and are working on getting Taste and See, a 4 week hospitality and outreach opportunity, up and running plus other outreach activitites. The Hope25 project is officially finished. Here are some interesting facts that came out of a survey by the Mission and Ministry commission of Hope25 leaders:

8,500 copies of the Hope25 Lenten Studies were purchased

55,000 copies of the Luke gospels and 70,000 prayer cards were distributed across the country

Over 1500 people joined up to the website and received the monthly newsletters

22,000 unique visitors to the website over 18 months

21 episodes of the H25 podcast were posted

15,800 visits to H25 you tube channel

88,000 views on H25 Facebook page

The level of participation in the online training revealed a hunger amongst lay people for relevant evangelism training

A report has been prepared for the General Synod Standing Committee based on this survey of Hope25 leaders with recommendations for maintaining the momentum that Hope25 generated including request for money to keep the Hope25 website running under the new name of Hope Forward. At this stage the plan is to keep the website running for as long as they have finances to do so.

Overall the survey revealed that doing the mission as a united Anglican church went well and the theme of hope worked very well. They observed that where the Bishop of a Diocese got behind the initiative either by self or via a delegated group the initiative had the most traction.

We can be very thankful that Bishop Richard fully supported this initiative in our Diocese, and the motion to keep evangelistic outreach a priority in our Diocese into the future with the continuation of the Diocesan Hope25 Facilitation Team under a new name yet to be decided. The team presented an evangelistic outreach strategic plan to Bishop in Council who endorsed it and said they will offer the team whatever support is needed.

Our parish team, now named Good News Facilitators, will continue to help our parish move forward in the area of evangelistic outreach. Thankyou everyone for your support of and efforts during the Season of Hope25. We will continue to share stories of hope till the end of the year so if you have a story of hope please send it to Leah.
